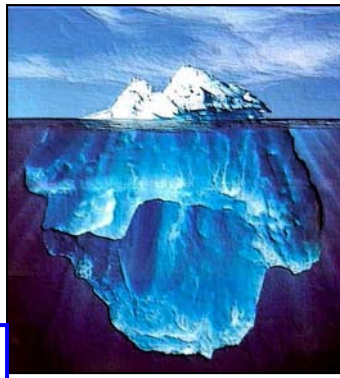

**Information Corner:** At Ram Powell we have developed a Job Task Exposure sheet for each piece of equipment. We have learned that repetitive exposures can either be eliminated or Alarped. Each SWI or Exposure is captured on this equipment sheet. This sheet is printed out with the Permit when someone is working on any piece of equipment. This keeps the personnel informed of past exposures around that particular piece of equipment so that everyone can learn from past history. This also helps us develop better JSA's and LOP's for working on or with that piece of equipment. Just another way to help us reach GOAL ZERO.

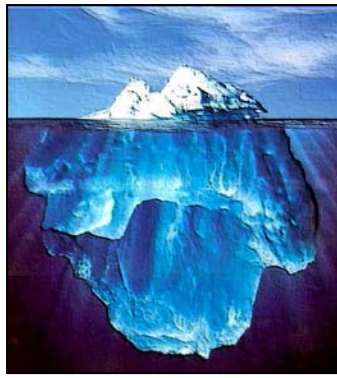
